Denver Animal Shelter Achieves LEED Platinum

GTC is pleased to announce that a project we recently completed achieved Platinum certification in the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) program. This new state-of-the-art animal shelter for the City and County of Denver went through numerous stringent measures to meet criteria for the LEED program, and it is currently the only animal facility in the United States achieve the prestigious Platinum certification.

GTC worked with City and County of Denver officials and the architect, Animal Arts, to ensure that the new shelter was eco-friendly. Because a chemical





plant once operated on the site, extra precautions needed to be taken to rehabilitate the site and ensure any potential contaminants in the soil did not reach nearby storm water reservoirs. Several sustainable aspects of the shelter that lead to LEED Platinum certification included remediation of the site's contaminated soil, use of recycled-content and locally purchased materials, use of low volatile organic compound (VOC) materials, skylights and daylight-sensing lighting as well as radiant heated floors to reduce energy use, sustainably harvested wood products, water efficient fixtures, and use of native plants in landscaping.

Natalie Vogt, GTC's Project Manager and Sustainable Initiatives Manager, was instrumental in achieving certification for the animal shelter. She said, "Personally,

sustainable development and environmental stewardship are gut level values of mine, so to be 1) working for GTC, a company who shares those values, and 2) involved with a project that epitomizes those values, is overwhelmingly gratifying. The efforts of our project team of engineers, architects, and contractors was astounding – each member bringing their specific talents to the mix, and following through to the finish. The LEED Platinum Certification is a just reward. Additional thanks to the City and County of Denver for setting the expectation, then fostering our overachievement."



GTC's Vice President, Andy Fiamengo, added "The City and County of Denver did a wonderful job of bringing together all the right players for their project. The project was originally slated for LEED Silver, however we realized



relatively early on that we were really in a position to capture LEED Platinum. Animal Arts (project architect) was once again a super-star team member as were the City and County folks who participated in the project from pre-construction through completion. I only wish we could do a project like this with the same team members every year."

The Denver Animal Shelter hosted Grand Opening celebrations in June of 2011.
